

Health and Hygiene Policy

The health and welfare of all children and staff is paramount. We believe that it is essential to maintain a healthy and hygienic area where children can play in safety.

We hope to achieve this by the following means:

- 1. The Preschool operates a non-smoking policy and a 'Nut-Free' zone.
- 2. Children will be encouraged to wash their hands after going to the toilet and after messy play. They will also be required to wash their hands before eating.
- 3. No child will be left alone while eating.
- 4. Tables used for snack/lunch will be cleaned and disinfected.
- 5. All equipment used in the preparation of food will be kept clean and sterilised on a regular basis.
- 6. Children will be encouraged to help in the preparation and distribution of the snacks where appropriate.
- 7. Each child will receive milk or water to drink.
- 8. A variety of nutritious snacks will be provided.
- 9. Any special dietary needs will be met.
- 10. Children will be encouraged to develop good eating habits in line with the Healthy Eating Policy.
- 11. Members from the Health Care Agencies will be invited to the group to interact with the children.
- 12. Inhalers will be only administered to a child when written permission has been given by Parents/Carers.
- 13. Parents/Carers will be asked to provide inhalers for their own child and to indicate the correct dosage.
- 14. Parents/Carers will be required to record any medicines their child may have had before coming to Preschool.
- 15. A child who has been ill should not come to the group for at least 24 hours after the illness has ceased. In cases of diarrhoea and/or vomiting, the exclusion period should last until the child has been free of symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting for at least 48 hours and has had at least one normal motion.
- 16. Please see the Infection, Prevention and Control Policy for more information and guidance.
- 17. Any child who is obviously unwell will be sent home at the discretion of the Preschool Manager or RHS Matron.
- 18. A child's temperate may be checked using a digital thermometer.
- 19. Staff will receive appropriate First Aid Training and ensure it is within date.

20. At least 50% of the Preschool staff will have current Paediatric First Aid Training.

Monitoring and evaluation
